A Survey made to establish the south west corner of Holmes County,

To the Honorable Board of Commissioners of Knox, Coshocton and Holmes Counties in the State of Ohio:

We, the undersigned County Surveyors of our respective Counties; namely, Knox Coshocton and Holmes in the State of Ohio, in obedience to an order made by the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of their respective Counties, to determine and establish the corner at the point where the Counties of Holmes and Coshocton corner on the east line of Knox County, make the following Report:

Pursuant to your order we met on the 15th day of November, 1887, and after taking to our assistance Zachariah Workman and Osborne Hibbits as chain carriers, William Reid as arman and John Flood as marker, all being duly sworn, we proceeded to survey and establish said disputed corner.

We began at a well defined and undisputed corner on the line between Knox and Holmes Counties, being at the north-east corner of Section 21, Township 8, Range 10, in Knox County Ohio, which corner is also the north-west corner of Section 25, Township 8, Range 9 in Holmes County, Ohio, and extended a line south past said disputed corner and along the line between Knox and Coshocton Counties to the south-east corner of Lot 8 in the 1st Quarter Township of Township 7, Range 10, in Knox County, Ohio, where we found the original bearing or witness trees to said corner: thence continuing south on the line between said Counties to the south east corner of Lot 7, in said last named Quarter Township and Range where we found one original bearing or witness tree; thence continuing south along the line between said Counties to the south west corner of Section 5, Township 7, Range 9, in Coshocton County, Ohio, where we found the original witness or bearing trees which enabled us to establish a corner at that point, making the distance from the place of beginning 646 rods.

We then proceeded to the south-east corner of the west half of Section 25, Township 8, Range 9 in Holmes County, Ohio, which corner is also the north-east corner of the west half of Section 5 Township 7, Range 9, in Coshocton County, Ohio, where we found an original bearing or witness tree from which we established the corner. We then extended the line west along the line between Holmes and Coshocton Counties from said last established corner to intersect the aforesaid line; we then extended the line west into Knox County between Townships 7 and 8, Range 10, of said County. We then established a stone monument at the intersection of said lines, which marks the southwest corner of Holmes County and the northwest corner of Coshocton County on the east line of Knox County, in the State of Ohio.

All of which is respectfully submitted with a plat hereto attached and made a part of this Report. Dated this 23 day of November A.D. 1887.
