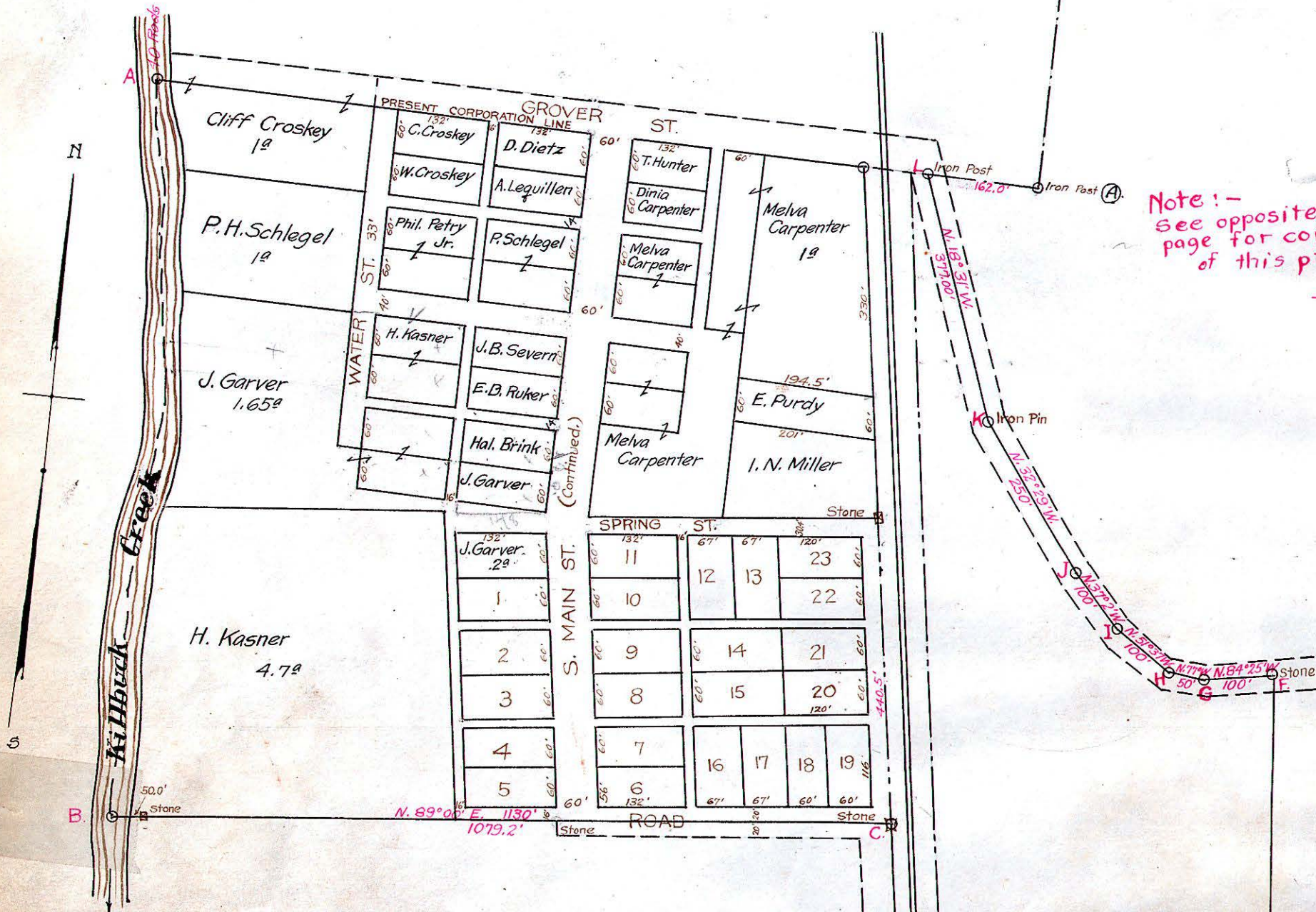

Present Killbuck Village



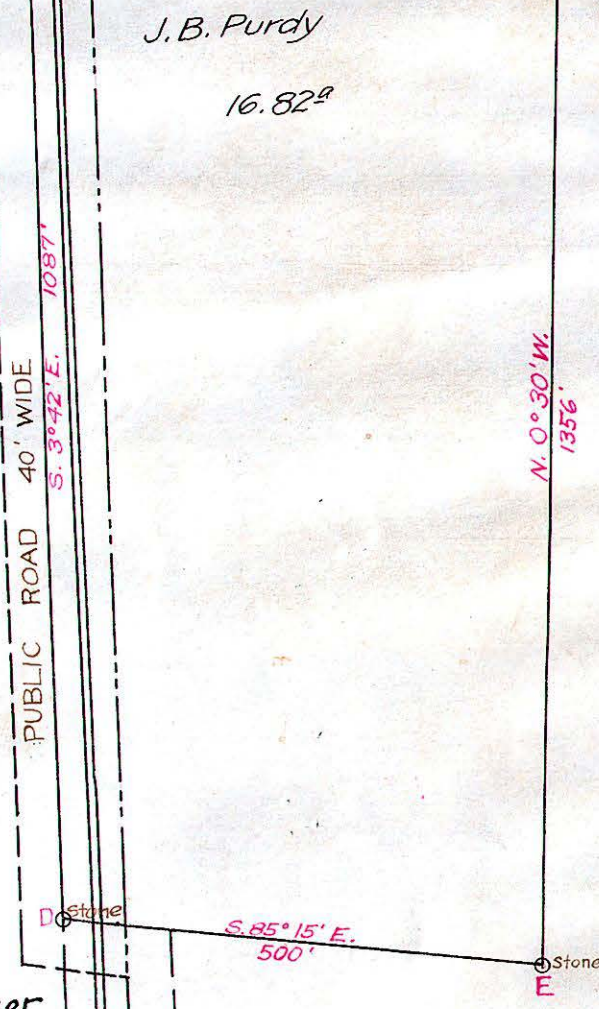

 VILLAGE OF KILLBUCK

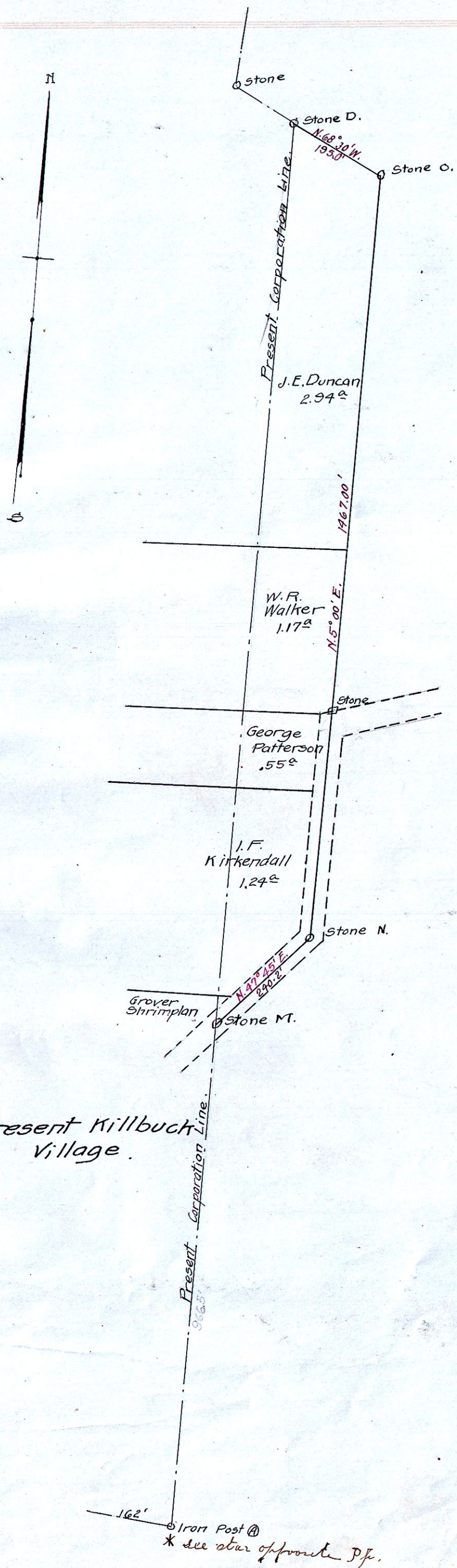

To the Board of Commissioners of Holmes County, Ohio.

The undersigned respectively represents that they are a majority of the adult freeholders in Territory adjacent to the Municipal Corporation of Killbuck, Holmes County, Ohio. That this petition is filed at their own option and ask that the following described Territory be attached and annexed to the said Incorporated Village of Killbuck, Holmes County, Ohio, to wit: Beginning at the South West corner of the present Corporation in the center of Killbuck Creek and being 40 rods south of the North West corner of Section fifteen (15) in Township Eight (8) of Range seven (7). Thence South in the center of the Creek 1745 feet; Thence North eighty Nine (89) degrees East fifty (50) feet to a stone on the bank of the Creek. Thence North eighty Nine (89) degrees East 1079.2 feet to a stone on the West side of the Dresden Branch of the C. O. & C. Ry. Thence South three (3) degrees and forty two (42) minutes East along the West side of said Railroad grounds 1087 feet to a stone on the quarter Section line. Thence South 85 1/2 degrees East 500 feet to a stone on said quarter Section line. Thence North 1/2 degree West 1556 feet to a stone in the public road; Thence South 84 degrees and 25 minutes West 100 feet; Thence North 77 degrees West 50 feet; Thence North 51 degrees and 37 minutes West 100 feet; Thence North 37 degrees and 2 minutes West 100 feet; Thence North 32 degrees and 29 minutes West 250 feet to an iron post in the public road; Thence North 18 degrees and 31 minutes West 377 feet to an iron post in the public road and on the present South Corporation line; Thence East along said South line 162 feet to the South East corner of the present Corporation line; Thence North 4 degrees East 966.5 feet to an iron post in the center of the public road and on the present Corporation line; Thence North 47 degrees 45 minutes East 2402 feet; Thence North 5 degrees East 1467 feet to a stone; Thence North 86 1/2 degrees West 95 feet to a stone on the present Corporation line.

Accepting the petition of H. E. Kirkendall and others at the South end of the present Corporation of Killbuck Village, Ohio. Be it ordained by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Killbuck, Holmes County, Ohio, that 1st The petition filed by H. E. Kirkendall and others asking that a certain tract of land hereinafter described be annexed to and become a part of the Incorporated Village of Killbuck, Holmes County, Ohio. 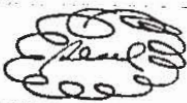
